New rules for international travellers

Upon arrival into Canada, all air travellers are required to;

- Take a COVID-19 molecular test before exiting the airport
- Reserve, prior to arrival back in Canada, a 3-night stay in a government-authorized hotel at their own expense
- Continue 14-day quarantine
- Take another COVID-19 molecular test at end of quarantine period

New support for highly affected sectors

In January, I announced the new Highly Affected Sectors Credit Availability Program for hardest-hit businesses and support to workers and their families through 100% government backed loans.

- Open to all Canadian businesses that have been hit hard by the pandemic—including tourism, hotels, restaurants, and other sectors that rely on in-person service
- Eligible businesses can apply for low-interest loans from 25k to \$1 million & for businesses with multiple locations under one entity, up to 6.25 million

through the Anti-Racism Action Program to foster inclusivity and reduce systematic barriers due to Islamophobia.

MAKING PROGRESS AND MOVING FORWARD

INTRODUCING STRONGER MEASURES TO KEEP CANADIANS SAFE FROM GUN VIOLENCE

In 2019 we passed legislation to strengthen background checks, and in 2020, we prohibited firearms that were designed for military-use.

And just last month, we introduced legislation that makes our communities safer by targeting gun violence and criminal activity, and addressing intimate partner violence, self-harm, and online hate.

DELIVERING ON PUBLIC TRANSIT ACROSS CANADA

Our Government announced a new \$14.9 billion for public transit projects over the next eight years, which includes permanent funding of \$3 billion per year for Canadian communities beginning in 2026-27.

Investing in public transit infrastructure shortens commute times for families, creates good middle-class jobs, grows our economy, and cuts air pollution.

1000+ NEW PROJECTS TO KEEP SENIORS SAFE & HEALTHY

As announced in our Speech from the Throne, our Government is moving forward on establishing national standards for long-term care for Canadian seniors in addition to committing \$1 Billion for a Safe Long-Term Care Fund.

Our Government will continue to work with the provinces and territories to ensure seniors in our communities are being protected and supported during COVID-19.
